

Lydney is in the process of change. The Core Strategy for the Forest of Dean will see an increase of nearly 2,000 houses within the Parish of Lydney. The Steering Group have decided to prepare a Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) to express the needs and desires of the people of Lydney to ensure that the Town grows systematically alongside these housing developments.

To make sure that your voice is heard, we are preparing a series of questionnaires, consultations and workshops to ensure that the plan for Lydney reflects the voice of its residents.
