

What does the NDP propose for Lydney?

Over the next 20 years the NDP is seeking to develop Lydney as a prosperous, safe, attractive and socially inclusive community. We are using public consultations, questionnaires, meetings and research which has been undertaken by the Community Steering Group.

The plan proposes to improve five main areas:

Working & Shopping



- encouraging new large stores to move to Lydney; providing choice and a range of different goods
- enhancing shop fronts and retail space via Shop Front Improvement Grants secured against developmental plans
- creating a focal point for the town and attracting a weekly market.

More jobs will be provided by:

- promoting and developing new and existing business opportunities
- improving access to community facilities and residential developments.

Health & Leisure

Improved health and leisure services will be provided by:

- services will be provided by:securing NHS G.P. and Dental practices
- expanding Lydney Hospital
- relocation of the hospital when needed
- encouraging healthier lifestyles with new walking/cycling routes
- promoting the parklands as areas of relaxation
- identifying sites for sports arenas
- supporting the success of Lydney sports teams and facilities
- new community facility, space for the community to relax together
- enhance the harbour and promote as a unique tourist attraction.






Housing & Education

New quality housing will develop by:

- building affordable housing for first time buyers
- good housing provision for the retired, to enjoy independent living
- increasing education provision to enhance the town for families moving in
- balancing new open space housing with leisure facilities.

Environment

A positive well cared for environment will benefit all who visit or live in Lydney:

- encouraging recycling and renewable energy to give Lydney an environmentally friendly future
- promoting and supporting local tourism
- raising awareness of environmental responsibility
- providing more recycling services.

Getting around

Transport routes, links and facilities will be improved by:

- improving road, rail and bus links between other areas of the Forest of Dean and beyond
- ensuring consideration is given to a link road between the A48 Bypass and the town centre
- establishing safe pedestrian and cycle routes between the town centre, housing developments (existing and future) and the train station.




Caring for the neighbourhood = Caring for one another
