

How Lydney Town Council Determines its Annual Budget

The Town Council's budget is calculated via PBP (Policy, Budget, Precept) determination.

The Process

- 1) Each September/October Committees meet to discuss their financial requirements for the forthcoming financial year, considering contractual payments, projects and whether they wish to continue to provide a particular service or whether to expand/improve an area Cemetery project, secure additional burial provision.
- In Lydney Town Council's case the Charitable Trusts are required to do likewise however it must be recognised that although the Town Council have Sole Custodial responsibility, the Trusts have no power to influence the Council's decision and this in itself therefore means a balancing act between the service provision/budget which will eventually be approved by Council and the necessity to include in the Council's budget a sum of money which can be donated to each of its charitable Trusts.
- 3) Once each of the Committees (and Trusts) have considered and approved the agreed budget for the following financial year and this has been duly Minuted, these sums are collated on to one financial summary sheet.
- 4) The collated summary sheet is then considered by the Finance and Scrutiny Committee who (should be) then looking at the total budget figure (already agreed by the Committees/Trusts) and considering it against the 'offset' figures.
- 5) The Council's Budget (including Precept demand, which is determined by taking the total budget, deducting the percentage income to be used and the 'offset' figure (taken from G/Rs) is then voted upon by the Finance & Scrutiny Committee and then becomes a recommendation to that of Full Council.
- 6) During either December/January each year Full Council are then presented with the Finance & Scrutiny Committee's budgetary recommendation. Members are then required to consider and approve their recommendation and consider and approve the Precept demand determined therefrom.
- 7) As the new financial year commences a new Daily Book, Council's financial accounting sheet (which is kept in accordance with Parish/Town Councils Audit regulations) is created.

Throughout the year the agendas listing the matters to be discussed at the Town Council meetings are advertised in advance, on notice boards across the Town and are available to view via the Town Council's Website.

Town Council Engagement with the community

In 2017/18, the Town Council continued to communicate with the public in various ways; through its Newsletter, Press Releases, Councillor Surgeries, Website and via the Notice Boards throughout the Town.

The Town Council also increased its usage of social media via Facebook and Twitter which it uses to publicise its meeting dates, event information and Councillor surgery dates.

The Town Council remains committed to exchanging information with its partners as listed in the Council's Purpose Statement and is signed up to the Gloucestershire Charter. The Town Council also oversees neighbourhood partnership initiatives and is encouraging the establishment of various "Friends of" groups.

Provision of information and transparency is key in building trust within the community the Council serves and the Town Council continually seeks to be more effective and proactive in this area. Full details of the information and documents which are published by the Town Council are included in our Freedom of Information Publication Scheme; soon to be GDPR) this includes how to access the information.

Do you know where the Defibrillators are located in Lydney???

During February Lydney Town Council staff attended their annual Automated External Defibrillator refresher training. We wanted to highlight that Defibrillators are sited outside of the Council building at Claremont House and also the workshop in Bathurst Park. Both units are registered with the emergency services. This means that in case of emergency if help was not immediately at hand from someone with an access code you need to call 999 and they will provide you with the access code to the Defib cabinet. No medical training is needed to operate these units as they guide you on what to do.

FRIENDS OF LYDNEY HOSPITAL - FEBRUARY 2018

The first phase of the Forest Consultation into the future for the community hospitals has now concluded with a decision taken by the respective NHS trusts that a replacement single hospital will be built in place of the two existing hospitals. The broad location for the new hospital will be established in a few months' time and this will be in Cinderford, Coleford or Lydney. The hospital will not be available for public use until 2022 at the earliest, and in the meantime assurances have been given that the existing hospitals will continue to function as at present without any reduction in services. As a result of this decision, we will need to provide full support to the Matron and staff for at least the next four years, and the Friends will try to maintain fundraising at or beyond current levels regardless of whether or not the new hospital is built in Lydney.

The Friends will fully support the local community of Lydney and District in lobbying for the hospital to come to Lydney. This support will include participating in a presentation to the advisory group which the Trust intends to convene shortly to assess the relative merits of the different location options. There are persuasive arguments in Lydney's favour and these will be fully analysed and quantified prior to the formal presentation.
