



Lydney's Christmas Lights Switch-On





Assisted by his dedicated team of helpers (*including an elf!*), Santa gave every child who visited a present whilst hearing what they'd like for Christmas. As well as featuring Santa's grotto, Newerne Street also hosted a number of fairground rides from Danter's – as always proving to be a very popular attraction.

The evening commenced at 5pm with 'live' music from so many very talented (and very brave!) young performers, followed by a musical interlude from Lydney Training Band, Lydney C. of E. and Severnbanks Primary Schools adding to the merriment by singing a number of well rehearsed carols; seeing so many youngsters participating was incredibly rewarding and certainly a highlight.

At 6pm, well-known ceramist Mary Rose Young officially 'switched-on 'Lydney's Christmas lights. Displayed throughout Newerne Street, Hill Street and High Street our Town was lit for the festive season, these lights, coupled with the Town's Christmas tree has made Lydney look fantastic. Following the switch-on, Lydney Training Band and local musicians treated crowds to further excellent performances, the event drawing to a close at 6:30pm, with Father Christmas heading back to the North Pole.

<u>'LEST WE FORGET' - The Re-siting of the Silent Solider Silhouettes</u>

Lydney's popular soldier silhouettes, purchased to commemorate all those who tragically lost their lives in World War One, are to be re-located to Bathurst Park. These silhouettes, which were later complimented with handmade poppies by a local scout group, have been 'standing guard' at the town's gateways since the run up to Armistice Day. With this year's remembrance services now concluded, Councillors resolved at their November meeting not to place in storage until next year but to instead re-position them in the Town's popular Park.



Cllr Harry Ives, Chairman of the Bathurst Park and Recreation Trust, said "These soldiers are a very welcome addition and will overlook our Memorial Gardens throughout the year. Come Remembrance Day next November, these poignant silhouettes will be returned once again to the Town's gateways. In the meantime, all are welcome to come and spend time reflecting further on their meaning in the beautiful surroundings of Bathurst Park".

Jayne Smailes, Chief Executive of Lydney Town Council said "Following the overwhelming response from local residents and the wider community in relation to the initial siting of the silhouettes at the Town Gateways, Councillors have decided to continue to display the Silent Soldier Silhouette as a symbol of our Town's lasting mark of respect".

The Council have also purchased a remembrancethemed bench - now permanently sited on Hill Street'; a further act of commemoration to mark the Centenary of Armistice.





BATHURST PARK FIREWORK DISPLAY - 2018


