# 12. COUNCILLORS REPORTS

Responding to a question which had been raised by Cllr Leach, Cllr Preest advised that the manhole cover in Bream Road had already been reported several times to Severn Trent Water, however, the organisation had yet to take action. Cllr Preest confirmed that both the Portfolio Holder at Gloucestershire County Council and the Local Highway Manager were attempting to progress the repair with Severn Trent Water. Cllr Greenwood reported that a manhole cover opposite D & M Pizza also rattled.

Cllr Leach highlighted the deterioration in the condition of the road surface from the junction of Bream Road and High Street to Lydney C of E School. Cllr Preest advised that Gloucestershire County Council's Local Highway Manager was aware of the issue.

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Cllr Preest advised that he had received a number of complaints regarding the work which was being undertaken to implement the Lydney Cycleway scheme and reported that a senior Highway Officer at Gloucestershire County Council would be willing to visit Lydney.

Cllr Leach advised that he had been contacted by members of the public regarding the practice by traders of placing "A" boards in the middle of the pavement. Cllr Preest requested that Town Council staff report the issue to Gloucestershire County Council's Local Highway Manager.

Cllr Greenwood informed Members that a meeting of the Multi Use Track Stakeholder Group would take place the following day, at which he hoped a decision would be made regarding the route.
